The 2010 ETEE Europa Conference is intended to bring together schools and support services currently working in bilingual modes or hoping to do so. The conference is designed to stimulate debate on the future shape of a multilingual European curriculum.

All schools in England in particular are aware of the challenges in foreign language learning and the growing gap between a narrowly monolingual society and the commitment to a multilingual European Union. A new generation of European Schools is also emerging but curriculum and teacher training for the new model have yet to be determined.

Teachers, trainers, researchers, advisers and curriculum developers working or wishing to operate in a bilingual/bi-literate context will share best practices and proposals.



The English Trust for European Education (ETEE) focuses on European bilingual learning across the whole age-range of the school curriculum. We want to bring together schools which are engaged in CLIL (Content and Language Integrated Learning) or considering its introduction, not just in England, but also with schools in other European countries where the practice is more widespread. We want good practice to be celebrated, issues and challenges to be shared.
